### **HOW DO I REGISTER FOR PROGRAMS?**

#### **INTERNET REGISTRATION**

To register online or view shelter availability, please go to our website - [www.cityofmonroe.org](http://www.cityofmonroe.org).

Register online 24 hours a day/7 days a week with Visa, MasterCard or Discover Card. The first time you register online you will need to create an account with a password. Remember the password, for you will use this every time you register. After you have done that you can login and view all of our classes, how many spots are available and the program information. Once you have completed your registration and paid with your credit card, you will receive an email confirmation. Please be sure to check the receipt to confirm the details are correct. No other confirmation or reminders will be sent to you.

**Please note: There is a small convenience fee for all online registrations. Also, if a program is taxable, the tax will be added to the fee you see online.**

#### **BY MAIL, 24-HOUR DROP BOX OR IN-PERSON**

### **SHELTER RESERVATIONS**

All shelter rentals must be made in person. You can check availability online at [www.cityofmonroe.org](http://www.cityofmonroe.org) or by calling 329-2460.

Reservations for the Community Center, Shelter Houses, Bandshell and the Pool will be taken the first "working" day of the month for the entire month of the following year. For example on April 1, 2016 reservations can be made up to and including the entire month of April for 2017.

### **POOL MEMBERSHIP**

With the purchase of your season pool pass, you will get a pool key fob for each member of the family or keep your old key fobs from last year. Bring your pool key fob to the pool, it will be swiped by Pool Coordinator each time you come to the pool and your picture will come up in our computer. This prevents the sharing of pool passes. If you forget your key fob, don't worry, we will look up your name on the computer.

Each family member who is on your pool pass will need to get their picture taken. This picture will be kept in the computer at the Park and Recreation office and at the pool to help the staff identify members of your family. If you forgot your key fob or if we question if this person is part of your family, the pictures will help.

Pictures can be taken at the pool or Park and Recreation office. Pictures don't need to be taken each year. **KEEP YOUR KEY FOB FROM LAST YEAR & USE WITH THIS YEAR'S RENEWAL.** If you register between March 7th - June 3rd, you will get \$5.00 off season pass. After June 3rd, there is no discount.

### **Heat/Humidity Guidelines**

After a Heat Advisory (heat index of 105 or more) or Heat Warning (heat index of 115 or more) is issued by the National Weather Service, the following actions by the Recreation Department will take place: Approximately 30 minutes prior to the start of any outdoor activity, temperature, humidity and heat index readings will be taken from the National Weather Service or other weather related agencies or sources of information.

#### **A. Heat Index of 80-89 (Low to Moderate Risk)**

Proceed with scheduled outdoor activity. Monitor participants carefully for necessary action. Encourage additional fluid intake.

#### **B. Heat Index of 90 -104 (Moderate Risk)**

Use caution. Fluid/Shade/Rest breaks should be taken every 20-25 minutes. Activity should be modified for less exertion. Consider reducing program length.

#### **C. Heat Index of 105-114 (High Risk)**

Use extreme caution. Fluid/Shade/Rest should be taken every 15-20 minutes. Reduce program length to no more than 60 minutes per class. Additional instructor breaks. Consider cancellation of youth and senior programs of high exertion activities.

#### **D. Heat index of 115-130 (Very High Risk)**

We will cancel all outdoor activities.

Please note: Some discretion is granted to the Recreation Department in making decisions, as programs with abundant shade, water and frequent breezes may not require above modifications. The Monroe Park & Recreation Department will have the final say on all cancellations. Every effort will be made to reschedule classes canceled due to inclement weather. If classes cannot be rescheduled, refunds will not be given.

### **Employment Opportunities**

**Online Applications ONLY:** The City of Monroe only accepts online applications for seasonal or fulltime positions. You also may fill out an interest card online and get updates on job openings.

#### **Apply for Seasonal Positions**

December 1 - March 1 each year, we accept applications for summer/seasonal positions. Some positions closed on February 1 and some on March 1. Recommended minimum age is 16, lifeguard must be 16 by June 1st. Park and Street maintenance required age is 18. Possible summer positions may be: lifeguard and swim instructor, summer park & street maintenance, umpires, playground positions, after school aides, day camp and sport instructors. # Lifeguards describe the "Pool Lady"!

Barb has been described as many things throughout her career, but one thing most lifeguards can agree on is that she is **"Our Summer Grandmother," as stated by Matt Coplien, or as Jamie Dickey said "Everyone's Mama" for the lifeguards and the children that come to the pool.** She has also been described by past lifeguards as such a loving and giving lady, who's always there to tell a good story and to play match maker for the guards too. **Jeff Reber described her as "the den mother who was always willing to give advice to us even though we thought we were adults already,"** which has been proven to be true in many of the lifeguards stories.

Lifeguards have come and gone, but some stay longer than others. The guards come back to experience her wisdom, and create wonderful memories with her.

**Chris Deinger stated, "I spent 7 summers with Barb, that is 21 months of her mentoring me into adulthood.**

She was/is a second mom for me and for many of the guards and is loved dearly for being there for them."

**Tyler Moser states, "She has been such an influence in my life, especially since I started working with her as a guard. People always ask if we are related and I wish I could say yes without lying!"**

Barb is known for her signature giggle, kind smile and big heart. Not only has she touched the lives of the lifeguards, but she has also touched the lives of the community.

**Eric Tabaka described her as, "A wonderful woman with the gift of connecting with children." With such a kind and warmhearted soul, the kids love her and recognize her as the famous "Pool Lady."**

Brittany Moser, Barb's daughter, stated working for her Mom was a special time. Brittany had a unique perspective when working with her Mom because she already respected her as a Mom. She had the opportunity to learn from her first hand, not only how to be a true professional, but also to treat people with kindness, a smile, and patience. She watched as her Mom worked her magic and built rapport with the public. Brittany grew up at the pool and saw how her Mom created such a family atmosphere at the pool. All the guards were so lucky to have her Mom's support and genuine rapport with her each summer. **"I was so fortunate to have worked at the pool with my Mom, but I am blessed to be able to call her, Mom for a lifetime."**

Recreation Director Marge Klinzing says Barb has been by her side for 35 out of her 38 years here. She started with the After School program in 1981, handed out baskets at the pool, was then hired on as the Pool Coordinator, helped out with Park Patrol, Office Aide, dressed up as the Easter Bunny and Mrs. Claus. She also taught classes and took computer classes. She worked in the treasurer's office and helped out other city departments as well. **"She is the best "PR" person the City will ever have! She has such a great attitude and is positive and patient in everything she does. She is my ray of sunshine everyday, even on rainy days at the pool. She is always happy."** I once bought her a greeting card, on the outside it said "You are always so happy no matter how hectic things get." Inside the card it says...Are you from a different planet? "I'm so happy to have worked with her all these years but more important all the things we have shared and done together and the friends we have become."

But nothing sums up Barb more than **Linda Moser's statement about her, which states, "My word for Barb, after thinking long and hard, is 'Priceless'!** What would we, I, do without her in so many ways? She makes me laugh, she is empathetic with the guards, as well as the patrons, but still kindly and compassionately holds them to high expectations."

**Shannon Hawkinson said, "She was always there in the bathhouse with an open ear. You could go to her for anything. You could sound off ideas to her or ask for any kind of advice. She was a great source of ideas. The pool will be so different without her there for sure! Everyone will truly miss her."**





On the first day, you will be tested in these three areas. You will need to pass all three things in order to continue with the course.

1. Swim 300 yards continuously demonstrating breath control and rhythmic breathing. You may use the front crawl, breaststroke or a combination of both. Swim goggles can be used. You may not stop or swim on your back.
2. Tread water for 2 minutes using the legs only. Your hands will be placed under your armpits.
3. Complete a timed event within 1 minute and 40 seconds. Swim goggles **are not** allowed for this.
  - Starting in the water, swim 25 yards. Your face may be in or out of the water.
  - Surface dive feet first or head first to retrieve the 10 pound brick
  - Return to the surface and swim 25 yards on the back to the starting point. Both hands holding the object out of the water (on your chest) and keeping your face at or near the surface so you can get a breath when needed. Put the brick up and exit the water by jumping out.

**After Pretest Certification Requirements are:**

- Attend all class sessions. You cannot miss any classes.
- Demonstrate competency in all required skills and activities.
- Correctly answer at least 80% of the questions on the 3 sections of the final written exam.

Upon successful completion of all of these requirements the student will receive their Lifeguarding / First Aid certificate valid for 3 years and CPR/AED for the Professional Rescuer valid for 2 years and Water Park Certification.

# Pool Rules & Regulations

We are committed to making each visit to the Monroe Pool safe and pleasant. Please review our Rules & Regulations before entering the pool:

1. Children seven and under must be accompanied by an adult/guardian over 12 years old in the water (within arms reach) and on deck at all times.
2. No diving in any area of the pool except the diving well.
3. Patrons MUST take the deep water test to use the diving board or swim in the deep end.
4. No horseplay, running, shoving or dunking. Behavior that endangers the safety and well being of yourself and/or other patrons will not be allowed.
5. Profane language is not allowed.
6. All patrons must shower before entering the pool and after using the restroom facilities.
7. Patrons having diarrhea, contagious or infectious health conditions and/or open wounds will not be allowed in the pool per the discretion of the lifeguard or pool coordinator.
8. Patrons under the influence of alcohol or other drugs will not be allowed in the pool.
9. All patrons must wear appropriate swim attire. No cut-off shorts, gym shorts, blue jeans, clothing with rivets, buttons and/or zippers allowed.
10. Patrons who are not toilet-trained are required to wear swim diapers in addition to a swim suit. They may be purchased at the front desk.
11. Animals are not permitted in the pool area.
12. Food, drink, gum and tobacco products are not permitted on the pool deck.
13. Glass containers are not permitted in the facility.
14. Absolutely no swimming without lifeguards on duty.
15. All patrons must follow the directives of and be respectful of the lifeguard or instructor on duty. Failure to do so will result in the patron being asked to leave.
16. We are "family friendly" facility, please refrain from public affection.

## Diving Board & Slide Rules

Patrons must take the deep water test prior to using the diving board. A diving test will be given each day at 2:00pm break.

1. One person on the diving board at a time.
2. Patrons using the board must clear the water as quickly as possible.
3. Patrons on the board must wait for water to be clear.
4. Dive only from the front of the board.
5. Patrons may bounce once per use.
6. Dives must be forward facing only.
7. No throwing objects down the slide or off boards..
8. A rider must be 48" tall.
9. If under 48" they must be able to swim 10 yards unassisted.



## Closure

As much as we dislike to close the pool, sometimes we must if weather or low attendance dictates the situation. The following conditions will result in closing the pool:

- ⇒ On deck temperature of 65° or less and/or inclement weather is forecasted
- ⇒ If above 65° and low attendance for first hour, the pool will close early.
- ⇒ Sections of the pool such as the water slide or diving well may close if it has low attendance.







## NEW WISCONSIN VOTER PHOTO ID RULES

City Clerk Carol Stamm urges voters in the City of Monroe to plan now to make sure they have an acceptable photo ID to vote beginning in 2016.

Most voters already have one of the types of photo ID required to vote. An acceptable photo ID is not required to include a current address.

### Election Day

On Election Day, voters must show one of the following photo IDs before they can cast a ballot. These IDs are still valid if expired after the date of the most recent general election, which was November 4, 2014.

- Wisconsin Driver License
- Wisconsin State ID Card
- Military ID Card issued by the U.S. Uniformed Services
- U.S. Passport Book or Card

The following forms of photo ID are also acceptable:

- A Certificate of Naturalization that was issued no earlier than two years prior to the election
- Driver License Receipt issued by the WI DOT, within 45 days of issuance

- ID issued by a federally recognized Wisconsin Indian Tribe
- A photo ID issued by a Wisconsin accredited university or college, or technical college that contains the date the card was issued, signature of student, and an expiration date no later than two years after date of issuance. The university or college ID must be accompanied by a separate document that proves enrollment such as a tuition fee receipt, enrollment verification letter, or a class schedule.

If you do not have a valid Wisconsin Driver License or State ID, you can receive a free State ID from your local DMV if you specifically request a free ID for voting purposes. If you do not have a birth certificate, the DMV can help with that also. Please contact your local DMV for more information.

### Absentee Voting

During in-person absentee voting, voters must present photo ID just like on Election Day.

When voters request an absentee ballot by mail, they must include a photocopy of their photo ID with the request. However, voters who are "indefinitely confined" because of age, illness, infirmity or disability and voters in care facilities do not need a photo ID. Active members of the U.S. Armed Services who are away from home are also exempt from the photo ID requirement.

A photo ID is required to prove identity before being allowed to cast a ballot. The photo ID law should not be confused with proof of residency requirements. A proof of residence document must be provided by everyone before being allowed to register to vote. This determines the voting address, which is especially important for local elections. Voters must re-register to vote every time they have a change of name or address.

**ASSESSOR** - The City of Monroe has contracted with Associated Appraisal Consultants, Inc. to perform the assessing duties. The City Assessor's Office has the responsibility to discover, list and estimate the value of all taxable property as of January 1<sup>st</sup> of each year, except for manufacturing property which is assessed by the Department of Revenue. It is the Assessor's responsibility to ensure that all properties within the City are valued uniformly as market trends indicate. Please visit our website [www.apraz.com](http://www.apraz.com) to view assessed value. Click on Property Search on the left hand side, choose Green County and the City of Monroe. Property searches can be completed by parcel number or address. Assessment questions should be directed to Associated Appraisal at 1-800-721-4157.

Open Book will be held from 3:30pm until 5:30pm on May 12th, 2016 at City Hall. This is an opportunity for property owners to meet with the City Assessor to discuss their property valuation.

**DOG / CAT LICENSES** - The cost is \$9.00 for a dog that is spayed or neutered and \$29.00 for a dog that is not altered. Dog licenses need to be renewed annually. License for cats are \$5.00 if it is spayed or neutered and \$20.00 if unaltered. The cat license is good for the life of the cat. You need a proof of rabies vaccination from your veterinarian before you get a license.

### YARD WASTE STICKERS -

Yard waste that can be bagged, such as grass and leaves, should be in a clear or clear blue waterproof bag with capacity of no more than 33 gallons, and weighing no more than 60 pounds. Sticks, branches, brush, stalks or other yard waste not easily bagged should be tied in bundles. The bundles should be no more than 4 feet long and weigh no more than 60 pounds. A \$2 Yard Waste Sticker, which is available for purchase at City Hall or the Wastewater Treatment Plant, must be on each bag or bundle of yard waste. Yard waste should be kept separate from garbage and other recyclable materials.

### BATTERY DISPOSAL -

Batteries may be dropped off at the Monroe Wastewater Treatment Facility at 1224 10<sup>th</sup> Ave West or to the Treasurer's Office at City Hall. The recycling charge is \$2.50 per pound for common batteries and cordless tool batteries; and \$10.00 per pound for lithium batteries. Vehicle batteries can be placed next to your recycle cart for pick-up at no cost.

## BULKY WASTE STICKER

**COST** - You can get rid of junk anytime! You just need to pick up a bulky waste sticker. Get rid of: Refrigerators or freezers for \$50.00. Air conditioning units for \$40.00 each. Dehumidifiers for \$40.00 each. Washers, dryers, stoves, water heaters, boilers, furnaces, dishwashers for \$20.00 each. Tires for \$5.00 each. Household furniture, carpeting, toilets and sinks for \$10.00 each. Swing sets, poles for \$20.00. For lumber or plasterboard, call for prices on other things you want to get rid of!

- Payments can be mailed to 1110 18<sup>th</sup> Ave Monroe, Wisconsin 53566
- Walk up to the Treasurer's window. Drop them in the white drop box Drop box is located across the street from City Hall next to the blue postal boxes. No stamp is necessary on your payment if you put it in the white box. Payments are picked up every morning at 8:00 am. Please include a self-addressed stamped envelope to have a receipt mailed for your payment.



### WATER BILL PAYMENT -


### AUTOMOBILE REGISTRATION RENEWAL -

Automobiles, motorcycles, mopeds, and light duty truck registrations may be renewed at the Police Department. In addition to the State imposed fees, the Department also charges a counter fee for those services. **Checks are not accepted for these renewals.** The Department also registers vehicles in the form of temporary license plates. No vehicles may be operated on Wisconsin highways without some proof of registration. The Department will also begin issuing the metal permanent license plates. Again, there is a counter fee for these services, in addition to the State imposed fees.

### ALTERNATE STREET PARKING -

From November 15th until March 31st, from 12:00 midnight to 7:00 AM your car must be parked on the odd or even side of the street which corresponds with the day's date. In other words, if you park your car on the street before midnight, it must be on the odd/even side for the next day's date. The odd or even side of the street is determined by the house numbers on that side of the street. Areas around the square have designated snow routes.

**STREET PARKING** - It is unlawful to leave any vehicle parked on any city street for more than 48 consecutive hours. Any vehicle parked over the 48 hour limit will be tagged and then towed, at the owner's expense.

**BURN PERMIT** - Permits can be obtained from the Fire Chief's office.

**CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTOR** - Your home needs a carbon monoxide detector. The law went into effect February 2011. All single and two unit homes new and existing must install a CO detector on every floor level near sleeping areas. Buildings with more than two residential units also need smoke and CO detectors, and this installation is different.

**SMOKE DETECTOR** - Replace your smoke detector batteries every year in October.

**FIRE HYDRANT ADOPTION** - Find the nearest fire hydrant near your house and shovel the snow around it after each snow fall.

If you experience cloudy or rusty water which is common occurrence when performing this type of work, allow the tap to run for 3 to 5 minutes and it should clear up. If it does not clear up, please call the Water Utility Dept. at 608-329-2483.

**BUILDING PERMITS** - Many construction and remodeling projects, both inside and out, require a permit. Please contact the Building Inspections office at City Hall before work begins. Our new online Building Permit process is running smoothly as residents are able to apply for a permit anytime and anywhere their schedule allows by going to the City of Monroe website. Once here, hover over "Departments" from the horizontal bar across the top of the page. In the drop down box, click "Building Inspection/Zoning". The screen that comes up will have a link to Building Permit Applications as well as other applications. Once you have completed your application and clicked the submit button at the bottom, an E-mail will be sent to you letting you know that your permit has been processed and what the fee will be. You can then mail in your fee (in which case your placard and permit will be E-mailed to you); or stop at the Building Inspector's office at City Hall where you can make your payment and pick up your placard and permit. Your placard needs to be placed in a window facing the street. We also have (1) one computer at City Hall available for you to complete your permit. As work on your project progresses, remember to contact the Building Inspections office to schedule inspections.

**LEAF PICK UP** - Leaves can be raked into the gutter from October 15 to December 1 for pickup and composting at no cost to residents. Leaves should not be raked into the gutter any other time of the year.

**CHRISTMAS TREE PICK UP** - The City will pick up Christmas trees from December 26<sup>th</sup> through January 31<sup>st</sup> without a sticker. After that you will need a sticker.

**COMPUTER DISPOSAL** - Computer systems, laptops, printers, scanners, TVs, DVD players, stereos, microwaves, cell phones etc. can be dropped off at the Monroe Wastewater Treatment Facility, 1224 10th Ave. West, for recycling, at a charge of \$.35 per pound.

**MAILBOX MAINTENANCE** - Please check the condition of your mailbox and post and, if necessary, repair or replace them prior to winter. With daily exposure to the elements, mailboxes and their posts do deteriorate over time and may not be able to withstand Wisconsin's snow, freezing rain and high winds. The Street Department will repair / replace mailboxes and their posts only if they are hit directly by City snow plows; however the Department cannot be responsible for mail boxes and or posts that are so weak the weight of plowed snow or slush simply pushes them over.

**PAINT DISPOSAL** - Paint can be disposed of during regular garbage pick-up as long as the paint has been mixed with cat litter or oil dry and allowed to dry. The dried paint may be disposed of within the regular bag of garbage.

### CAN I TAKE THE CARTS WITH ME IF I MOVE?

No. The carts are an asset of the City's collection system, just like the collection vehicles, and must remain at the address to which they were issued.

### WHAT IS THE POLICY FOR DAMAGED OR STOLEN CARTS?

The cart manufacturer provides a ten year warranty covering all aspects of the cart. If your cart is damaged, please call the City of Monroe Streets and Sanitation Department at 329-2490. A staff member will be sent to your residence to fix or replace your cart. This service is provided free of charge if the damage occurred during regular use. If your cart is stolen, you will need to file a report with the Police Department by calling 329-2400; then, contact the City of Monroe Streets and Sanitation Department at 329-2490 and a new cart will be brought to you.

### WHAT MAY I PUT IN MY RECYCLING CART?

The following items may be placed in your recycling cart: Aluminum Cans; Aluminum Foil & Pie Tins; Cardboard; Cereal Boxes & Paper Towel Rolls; Glass Jars & Bottles; Junk Mail; Plastic Bottles & Containers 1-7; Magazines & Catalogs; Newspaper & Inserts; Office Paper & File Folders; Paper Bags; Plastic shopping bags; Telephone Books; and Tin or Steel Cans. This information is also displayed on the lid of your recycling cart.

### WHAT MAY I NOT PLACE IN MY RECYCLING CART?

The following items may NOT be placed in your recycling cart: Bubble Wrap; Ceramics or Dishes; Electronics; Food Waste; Hazardous Waste Containers; Light Bulbs, Window Glass or Mirrors; Motor Oil Containers; Pizza Boxes; Syringes or Medical Waste; or Yard Waste.

### HOW WILL THE CITY KEEP TRACK OF THE CARTS?

Each cart has a serial number and electronic ID tag linked to the address receiving the cart. This will help the city make warranty claims. The collection vehicles read the electronic ID tags. The collected information could be used to calculate recycling participation rates and to find carts moved from assigned addresses.

### WHERE SHOULD I STORE MY CARTS?

The best place to store your cart is in an indoor covered area like a garage or shed. Containers may also be stored outdoors to the side or rear of the house. Containers cannot be placed at the curb for collection prior to 24 hours before your scheduled collection day, and must be removed from the curb by the end of your scheduled collection day.

### ARE THESE CARTS ANIMAL PROOF AND WILL THEY BLOW OVER EASILY?

The carts are designed to reduce opportunities for animals to get into your trash and recyclables and are made to withstand inclement weather. They are very sturdy and you should not have problems with the carts blowing over.



## HOW SHOULD I CARE FOR MY CART?

Periodically cleaning the inside and outside of your cart with water will help keep it looking nice and eliminate odor. A garden hose with sprayer attachment works well for this. Also, before placing any ashes or coals inside the trash cart, make sure they are completely cool to avoid damaging the cart. Please note, under no circumstance should the carts be defaced by the use of markers, stickers or paint.

## CAN I PUT BAGS NEXT TO THE CARTS?

Yes. The carts are specifically designed to be used with an automated collection system. You must use the carts supplied by the City. All trash and recyclables must be placed inside the designated carts. The lids on the carts must be substantially closed.

If extra trash bags are outside of cart, they require an extra bag sticker. Please notify the Street Department at 329-2490 that you will have extra bags. If extra bags are being placed outside of cart continuously, you will be required to get a larger cart.

## WHERE DO I PLACE MY CARTS ON COLLECTION DAYS?

All carts must be placed either in the curb line or immediately adjacent to the curb line. If on-street parking is allowed on your side of the street, you may place your cart in the street with the wheels against the curb. This is the preferred location. If placing carts in the street will obstruct traffic, they should instead be placed at the end of your driveway or on the terrace within one foot of the curb. In all cases, make sure arrows on your cart's lid point toward the street and your cart is at least three feet from

any fixed objects such as mailboxes, trees, street lights or parked vehicles. Please leave a two to three foot gap between carts placed next to each other.

Yard waste may be dropped off free of charge for **Monroe residents only** at the Street Department on the following dates: Wednesdays 10:00am – 6:00pm and Saturdays 7:00am – 12:00pm.

## HISTORIC DISTRICT

### WHY DOES A BUSINESS IN THE HISTORIC DISTRICT NEED A CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATENESS?

A Certificate of Appropriateness is an application made by the property owner asking the Historic Preservation Commission to approve any changes – including any signage or color – to the exterior of their existing building within the District. If the Commission determines that the proposed changes are consistent with the character and features of the property and/or District, then a Certificate of Appropriateness will be issued. After issuance, the property owner still may need to obtain a Building Permit. For properties within the Historic District, no Building Permits will be issued without a Certificate of Appropriateness. For more information, please see the City of Monroe website. Again, hover over 'Departments' and scroll down and click on 'Building Inspections/Zoning'. Then click on 'Historic Preservation Plan' under General Information.

## URBAN FORESTRY

In 2015, the City of Monroe received an urban forestry grant from the State of Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources to perform a public tree inventory. The City of Monroe recognizes that trees provide important economic, social and environmental benefits that significantly improve the quality of urban life. Bluestem Forestry Consulting Inc. completed a tree inventory on street rights-of-way as well as City Parks during the summer of 2015. Bluestem also completed an

i-Tree analysis from inventory data. This document reports the findings of the inventory and i-Tree analysis and makes prioritized recommendations for managing the urban forest resource. Important points of inventory, current program and recommendations include:

- A total of 4,739 trees, 992 planting sites and 32 stumps were inventoried.
- 778 trees (16.3%) are green, black or white ash and are susceptible to Emerald Ash Borer (EAB). (98 Park ash, 680 Ash on street right-of-ways)
- There are 275 trees recommended for removal for safety reasons. This is 4.8% of total inventoried population. A typical first-time inventory averages removals between 3-10%.
- 244 Trees should be pruned for safety reasons (4.2% of total inventoried population). A typical inventory averages 3-7% safety prune. This is a very low safety/priority prune percentage.
- To create diversity and avoid overpopulation of species, the Wisconsin Dept. of Natural Resources recommends the forest should be comprised of not more than 5% of any one species and 10% of any one genus. Only two genus are over-represented. These are maple (49.0%) and ash (16.3%)
- A total of 76 different species were identified during the inventory.
- Park trees totaled 889. The remaining 3,850 trees are located on street rights-of-way.
- The total estimated replacement value of all trees inventoried is \$12,130,462.01. Bluestem Forestry Consulting Inc. uses the International Society of Arboriculture Valuation of Landscape Trees, Shrubs and Other Plants: A Guide to the Methods and Procedures for Appraising Amenity Plants (Ninth Edition) to determine valuation.
- Total street and park tree benefits total \$727,525. This figure is calculated using i-Tree and included stormwater runoff reduction, carbon dioxide reduction, energy savings, air quality improvement and property value increases. Tree Inventory data includes: GPS coordinates, Unique number, Address, Location, Growth space type, Species, DBH, Height, Replacement/dollar value, Condition rating, Utilities, Obstruction, inventory date, Defect/Diseases One & Two:T, Maintenance Activity, Heaving Sidewalk, Planting sites, Priority Rating, and Comments.

# Twining Park

**Twining Park** is the largest park within the City of Monroe. This 46-acre park is located at 425 14th Ave. It offers a variety of recreational facilities for everyone to enjoy. There are two lighted ball diamonds, four lighted sand volleyball courts, four horseshoe pits, two tennis courts, pickleball courts, two half-court basketball areas, a paved walkway, two playground equipment areas, an outdoor fitness area, a 18-hole disc golf course and a winding creek through the center of the park.


**Twining North** is located near the exit of the park (near YMCA). This shelter will seat 200 people, has four 20-amp receptacles, water spigot, three grills, a separate restroom building near the shelter, which includes drinking fountain and a water spigot. **The reservation fee is \$75.**

**Twining South (Selk Shelter)** is located closest to the ball fields and is near the preschool playground area. This shelter has a fireplace, seats 80 people, has four 20-amp receptacles, a drinking fountain, water spigot and restrooms.

**Twining West (Bruni Shelter)** is located closest to the sand volleyball courts. This shelter seats 70 people, has one 20-amp receptacle, drinking fountain and grill. No restrooms are included with this shelter. The restrooms are located in Bandshell area.

## Recreation Park

**Recreation Park** is a 12-acre park located at 1700 22nd Ave. The park includes an Olympic sized heated swimming pool, a lighted ball diamond, four tennis courts, a tennis practice board, two horseshoe pits and Swiss A.L.P.S. Playground.

**Recreation North** is located near the Swiss A.L.P.S. Playground. This shelter seats 100 people, has six 20-amp receptacles, grill, restrooms, water spigot and a drinking fountain near the shelter.

**Recreation South** is located close to Lake Francis and has seating for 90 people. It has three 20-amp receptacles, 2 fireplaces, grill, drinking fountain and a water spigot near the shelter. There are no restrooms attached to this shelter. **The reservation fee is \$65.**



### Monroe Municipal Pool

The park has an Olympic size heated pool with attached diving well. The wading pool has a zero depth entrance and contains various water features including: an arch jet, a twist and turn fountain, geysers, shower tunnel and duck slide. The pool also includes a 143 foot water slide and plunge pool. See pages 29-34 for pool hours, rates and activities.

The shelter seats 100 people, has two 20-amp receptacles, drinking fountain, water spigot, grill and restrooms. **The reservation fee is \$75.**

## Park Department

The Park Department maintains 18 in-city park properties of 110 acres along with the 90 acre Forest Prairie Park. These parks contain:

- 21 Buildings / Shelters
- 11 Playgrounds
- 2 Basketball Courts
- 1 Disc Golf Course
- 3 Swimming Pools
- 1 Batting Cage
- 14 Parking Lots
- 9 Tennis Courts
- 3 Soccer Fields
- 6 Ball Fields
- 1 Fitness Area
- 1 Dog Park

The Park Department maintains the 4 Monroe welcome signs and the 2 service organization recognition signs that are located at main entrances into the city.

The Park Department also oversees the forestry work in the city. A yearly trimming and removal program for terrace trees is organized; most of this work is contracted out. The Department also offers a spring and fall planting program. Residents can order trees and the Park Department will plant them.

### Dogs allowed at Forest Prairie Park ONLY

Dogs are **NOT** allowed at any park except Forest Prairie Park, near the Airport on Hwy 59. There are groomed hiking trails available. Dogs should be leashed or controlled by voice command. We would appreciate it if you please clean up after your dog.

## Planned Improvements for 2016

The 3 tennis courts at Northeast Park are scheduled to be resurfaced. Lines will be added to the courts so they will also be able to be used for Pickle Ball.

Plans are under way to replace the Twining Park South Shelter. A larger shelter and restrooms are needed to accommodate the use this park receives. The new shelter is planned to have an indoor kitchen area that may be reserved with the shelter. See page 44 for more details.

## 2015 Park Improvements

At the Recreation Park swimming pool, the filter systems for the main pool, plunge pool and wading pool were replaced.

### Batting Cage

A batting cage was installed in Twining Park near the east ball diamond. The funding for the batting cage was started with a memorial from the family of Mavis Riese. Other contributions for the project were received from: Monroe Morning Optimist Club, Monsignor Thomas F. **What is the Emerald Ash Borer?**

The EAB is an invasive insect native to Asia that was introduced into the United States via wooden packing material. It was first discovered near Detroit, Michigan in 2002. The insect has spread through the Midwest since its' arrival and was discovered in Wisconsin in 2008. In the fall of 2015, it was found in Monroe. In Asia, the insect has had little impact due to the existence of natural predators. However, there are no natural predators in the United States to keep the insect in check and therefore, it has had a devastating effect on the Ash Tree population.

**What are firewood quarantines?**

The moving of firewood has caused most EAB infestations. Green County is among one of the many quarantined counties in Wisconsin. Quarantines prohibit the movement of Ash trees, branches, firewood and any other ash wood products out of a quarantined county to a non-quarantined county unless the material is chipped to one inch or smaller.

**What is the City doing about EAB?**

A street tree inventory recently completed in Monroe identified that there are 680 terrace ash trees which is about 16% of the total street tree population. In 2016, the city plans to continue removing terrace ash trees that are in poor condition or are interfering with other infrastructures such as blocking stop signs or growing under overhead lines.

**Is the City cutting down my terrace tree?**

Property owners will also be contacted if the city will be removing their terrace ash tree. The terrace ash tree inventory and condition ratings can be seen on the city's website at [www.cityofmonroe.org](http://www.cityofmonroe.org) under the Department Park Recreation Forestry tab.

**What about chemical treatments?**

In 2015, 40 of the best ash trees in city parks were treated. In 2016, the city plans to begin a treatment program for ash trees that have been identified as being in good or excellent condition and have a trunk diameter of 9 inches or above. Property owners will be notified if the city will be treating their terrace ash tree. The treatment will protect the tree for two years.

**What can I do about ash trees on my private property?**

- Monitor your trees' health and watch for signs and symptoms such as dieback in the upper and outer tree top and "D" shaped exit holes in the bark where adult beetles have emerged.
- Understand chemical treatment options. Local garden centers have soil drench products that can be applied by property owners along with local tree care companies that do trunk injections.
- Private contractors can be hired for the removal of your tree. It is important to make sure you are working with a qualified contractor and they have the appropriate insurance and workers compensation coverage.

**Terrace Tree Planting**

The Monroe Parks and Recreation Department will offer a Spring Terrace Tree Planting Program. Tree orders for the **spring** planting have begun and are due on Friday, April 8th. Planting will begin the week of April 25th. Tree orders for the **fall** planting will be taken from Monday, August 1st through Friday, October 7th. Planting will begin Monday, October 24th.





- You must know the appropriate swim level in order to register for swim lessons, which is found on the yellow certificate you received in your school folders. If you do not know what level your child should be in, contact Marge Klinzing at 329-2465.
- If your child is in the wrong level, they will not be able to receive lessons if the correct level is full.

## Swimming Lesson Information:

- Your child will be tested on the first day of class to determine if they are in correct level.
- Bring swimming suit and towel with name on them.
- Parents are allowed on the deck the first and last day of class. You may watch the class from outside the fence on all other days.
- All students receive a certificate on the last day of lessons.

## **Level 1 - Intro to Water Skills (Compares to Polliwog 1 at YMCA)**

Enter and exit water using ladder steps for side, blow bubbles through mouth and nose, bobbing, opening eyes underwater, and retrieving submerged objects, front and back glides and floats, recover vertical position, roll from front to back, and back to front, tread water using arm and hand actions, alternating and simultaneous arm and leg actions on front and back and combination of both.

## **Level 2 - Fundamental Aquatic Skills (Compares Polliwog 2 &**

**Guppy at YMCA)** Gives participants success with fundamental skills. Enter and exit water by stepping or jumping from the side, fully submerge and hold breath, bobbing, open eyes under water and retrieve submerged objects, front jellyfish and tuck floats, front and back glides and floats, recover to vertical position roll from front to back and back to front, change direction of travel while swimming on front or back, tread water using arm and leg actions, combine arm and leg actions on front and back, finning arm action.

## **Level 3 - Stroke Development (Compares to Minnow at YMCA)**

Builds on the skills in level 2 through additional guided practice in deeper water. Enter water by jumping from the side, headfirst entries from side in sitting and kneeling positions, bobbing while moving toward safety, rotary breathing, survival, and back float, change from vertical to horizontal position on front and back, tread water, flutter, scissor, dolphin, and breaststroke kicks on front, front crawl and elementary backstroke.

## **Level 4 - Stroke Improvement (Compares to Fish at YMCA)**

Develops confidence in the skills learned and improves other aquatic skills. Headfirst entries from the side in compact and stride positions, swim underwater, feet first surface dive, survival swimming, front crawl, and backstroke open turns, tread water using 2 different kicks, front and back crawl, elementary backstroke, breaststroke, sidestroke and butterfly, flutter and dolphin kicks on back.

## **Level 5 - Stroke Refinement (Compares to Flying Fish at YMCA)**

Provides further coordination and refinement of strokes. Shallow-angle dive from the side then glide and begin a front stroke, tuck and pike surface dives, submerge completely, front flip turn and backstroke flip turn while swimming breaststroke, sidestroke and butterfly sculling.

## **Level 6 - Swimming and Proficiency (Compares to Shark at YMCA)**

Refines the strokes so participants swim them with ease, efficiency, power, and smoothness over greater distances. Level 6 is designed with "menu" options that focus on preparing participants for more advanced courses, including the Water Safety Instructor, or other aquatic activities such as competitive swimming or diving.

## Private Swim Lessons

If you wish to obtain private swim lessons, you can contact the lifeguards personally to set up swim lessons for your child. Private swim lessons are \$16 per half hour & are paid for at Pool.
